The Indigenous Student Summer Internship is generously supported by the Department of Biology at the University of New Brunswick in Fredericton and by participating faculty researchers. This internship is designed to accelerate a student's familiarity with a university setting in general and the Biology department in particular. The deserving student will work in a number of different labs and will therefore be exposed to a variety of biological disciplines and kinds of research activities, prior to starting his/her university degree.

The internship provides a student with eight weeks of salary support during the months of July and August. The successful applicant will be introduced to our research environment by actively participating in a project(s) that best suits their interests.

Eligibility:

This internship is open to all indigenous graduating grade 12 students who will be initiating a degree in Biology at UNBF in September of the same year. Students interested in the internship must apply to the Department of Biology by 4:00 p.m. Friday, April 30 2024 providing a resume, transcript of marks, and a letter outlining their key interests and career aspirations in the biological sciences.
