Scholarship Requirements:

- Candidate must be a student of Nackawic Senior High School with an acceptance of a post-secondary institution (university, community college, etc.)
- Candidates must be starting their first year of their post-secondary education in Fall 2024.
- Candidate must complete: The Application (three questions) and answer the Essay below.
- 1. Essay- Cindy absolutely loved her time at NHS, she could often be heard laughing in the hall, running to volleyball practice, or volunteering her time. Take us back to high school and tell us what it was like to go to Nackawic Senior High. The good and the bad. The benefits and disadvantages of going to a small school. Use examples.
- 2. Remember Be Creative, be funny, make sure your essay stands outs!
- 3. We are also seeking two students that:
 - Are altruistic and friendly to all.
 - Want to improve themselves so that they may give back to their community one day.
 - Has been active during their school years by participating in extracurricular activities or community volunteering.

When writing, you should be creative with your application questions and your essay. Remember: **humor is key!** Cindy loved a good laugh. Here is an example: When Cindy was in junior high school, a teacher punished her by forcing her to write an essay on any topic. Cindy, being a jokester, decided that she would write about snot. The first sentence in her essay was: "Snot, otherwise known as mucus, the tasty..."

Cindy was the owner of the Bayside Dental Clinic in Saint John, New Brunswick; she practiced dentistry for more than 15 years. She was extremely involved with dentistry, serving on the New Brunswick Dental Society's Board of Director for many years and sitting as a well-known member of the Saint John Dental Society. She graduated from Nackawic High School in 1989; went on to UNB and Dalhousie graduating in 1997.
